Julie Ball was the guest speaker for the meeting and her topic was King Mackerel. Can be found inshore and offshore. Smokers 30lbs. and up. Difference in color from the spanish mackerel and the lateral line. Things to look for are clear blue water, temperature break, and 78 degree water. Large live bunker and bluefish are good baits. Slow troll or anchor using 2-3 rods only. Wire leader with two #4 treble hooks. Hook the top hook through the nose of the bait and let the second one hang free.
