Old Business:

Neal Taylor reaffirmed the June 19<sup>th</sup> Members Only Club Flounder Tournament. Weigh-in will be at Vinings Marine (Taylor Landing) until 4 PM. A boat member must be in line to weigh fish by 4 PM. The Tournament runs from 8 AM to 4 PM. Winners are 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> place for 3 fish aggregate. Prizes will be announced. Cost per person is \$10. There will be a Calcutta (a 100% pay out for the largest fish) for any fisherman on a boat wanting to participate at \$10 per person. Sea Tow will donate a free 1-year membership to the Captain of the boat with the largest flounder. Also Sea Tow will give \$100 to the individual with the 3 largest weighed fish. Louis will call all Captains with crew selections. A picnic will follow the tournament. A minimum of 28 participants and 11 boats have registered for the tournament.

Wounded Warriors fishing On June 5<sup>th</sup> the first Wounded Warriors (14 warriors) fishing trip was held. The trip was organized by the NAC. Captain Will Bransom lead the successful event. Vinnings Marina at Taylors Land provided the picnic area for a picnic after the fishing trip. Fried fish donated or caught by the warriors was cleaned and fried along with hot dogs, hamburgers.
