Recent Catches

I had the pleasure of taking out Chuck Kahlert & Danny Dale out flounder fishing on my boat the Fishin Fool. We had a fair day catching 15+ flounder with only 7 keepers, the largest at 23.5".



We went to Hatteras and I had the pleasure of having Rick Williams, Stan Gold & Bill Bogue aboard the Fishin Fool. The tuna bite was nonexistent so we ended up deep dropping the Rockpile, fishing up to 230' catching Triggers, Snappers, Sea Bass, King Mackerall and a very large Puffer Fish.



April 2nd, 2006

Crew: Kevin Meyer & Doug Johnson

Left the dock around 9:00 am and started shore side of the first small boat channel in about 12 foot of water, one throwback. Kept working toward the 1st island with a couple more throwbacks and then on the ocean side, where the first island meets the bridge in about 50 foot of water, there they were. Caught eleven keepers and many throwbacks, had three around 5 pounds, Kevin caught the largest. Minnows and squid were the baits of choice.



Offshore Report from Bill Rellos:

Hatteras on Friday 4/14 Wind was 20 to 25 out of the SW. Seas 6' to 8' chop. Fished SE to the 000's to the 950 line in 35 fathoms, water temp was 66 to 67 degrees. Current was cranking North. As soon as we arrived, put the spread out knock down came tight but lost it after a minute fight, 15 minutes later knock down fish on, 10 minute fight a 40# YFT in the box, Skunk is gone. Fished an hour with nothing to show, just about ready to pull the plug and BAM again line goes off 40# YFT, lines back out and BAM 15 # Durado in the Box. Got lines out again and BAM WAHOOOOOOOOO, 20# in the BOX, lines in, BAM, 45# YFT in the box. By then the seas picked up to about 8' to 10' chop and it was time to pull the plug. On a 24' Aqua Sport, needless to say we had motor problems on the way in. We left them biting and it was one long ride from 32 miles off. It took 3 1/2 hours to get back to solid ground. Great crew and good time.

Headed her east to the 50 fathom line, still a little too cold for tuna up this way so we fished for what was on the bottom, target was blueline tilefish. We caught a ton, no idea how many. We were catching them 2 and 3 at a time. 2 by us that were hand cranking these things looking for possibly yet another IGFA record. 3 by those just meat fishing with electra-mates. Well, no records this time but we came home with every box on the boat filled. Besides the tilefish, we caught a bunch of sea bass up to 5 pounds, snowy grouper over 15 pounds, and cod to about 6 pounds. Jeff caught the largest tile and grouper. His tile was about 14 pounds. We had several others just about as big.

Try putting the bow of your boat right up to the pilings, on the down current side and work the ebb behind the pile, your bait will drop to the bottom and the fish just lay there waiting for an opportunity to feed.

Rockfish Muffins

Ingredients

1 Pound rockfish boiled until white and flaky
2 5oz. jars of Old English Sharp Cheddar Cheese (found at Farm Fresh Granby Street)
1 Package Old English Muffins
10 Ritz Crackers
1 Tsp Garlic Powder
1 Stick Butter (not margarine)
4 Tsp Mayo (add more or less to your taste)
Optional Salt and Pepper

Directions

Boil Rockfish.
Cut muffins in half.
Mix the remaining ingredients together.
Place muffins on a cookie sheet or pizza tray.
Put mixture on top of the muffins.
Put in FREEZER for about 30 minutes.
Take out and broil for 10 minutes or until golden brown.

Optional add raw onion to mixture and old bay freeze and broil.

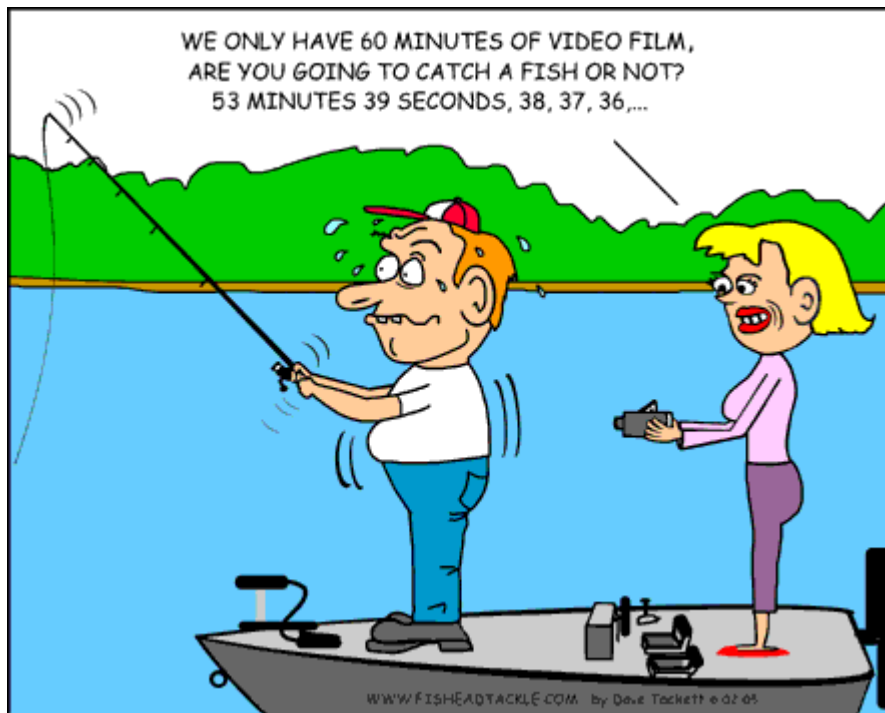

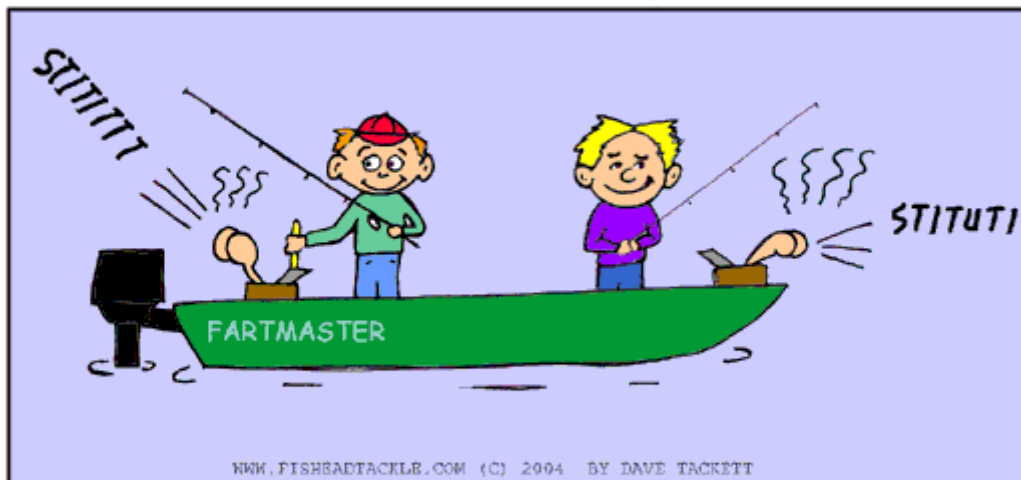
